Art and DT

Children will explore the artist 🥽 William Morris, focusing on his

motif textile designs and his influences on the art and crafts movement. We will look at the inspiration of nature upon his artwork as well as the repeated patterns, symmetry and minimalist colours he uses in his designs. Children will create their own motif using different techniques based upon the techniques he uses.

Within DT, children will be focusing on creating a sandal fit for a Roman Soldier. They will experiment with a range of different materials as well as sewing techniques such as running stitch, backstitch and overstitch.

<u>Humanities</u>

In History, we will learn about Ancient Rome and what life was like during this period. Children will look at who the Romans were and their influence on building their empire. They will also focus on significant Roman leaders, the importance of Hadrian's Wall and how Boudicca lead her rebellion. They will consolidate by looking at the impact the Romans had on Britain, debating their influence.

In Geography, children will explore rivers, seas and waters. They will look at the journey of a river, how they are made up and what happens when a river meets the sea. They will look at what happens when the river meets the coast and the range of

> different rivers that are located within the UK. This will then be consolidated by doing an in-depth study of the River Severn from Source to Mouth using Digimaps and six-figure grid references.

Literacy

In Literacy, the children will look at a range of literature. Our main text for this term is The Boy at the Back of the Class. In reading, the children will have opportunities to develop their inference skills, which

they will use to explore main themes in detail. Other text they will be studying are: The iron Man, Charlie and the Chocolate factory, as well

Numeracy

This term children will begin to explore the properties of quadrilaterals as well as conversions of different lengths and capacity. The children will also recap time and fractions. Roman numerals, division and multiplication will also be covered. Children will continue to develop their knowledge of interpreting statistics. They will also continue to develop their mental arithmetic skills as well as prepare for the upcoming multiplication check.



Science

In Science this term, children will explore the digestive system, including how it begins and focusing on the different types of teeth that exist in the human mouth. Children will recreate the digestive system in an experiment to see how the body digests food before investigating the diets and characteristics of a herbivore, carnivore and omnivore.

Then, children we will be exploring habitats, starting with our local area and looking at how it has changed. Children will look at the impact of environmental changes as well as natural disasters that happen in the world. Children will develop their knowledge of climate change, the negative effects of this and what we can do to help our planet. as well as look at local and distant habitats. The children will then

make an environmental plan based around how we can be more sustainable at school to reduce our impact on global warming and climate



P.E and Swimming Lessons

Children will need to wear their P.E and Swimming kit to school on a Friday. Children will have the opportunity to participate in a range of team sports such as net and ball games to learn and develop new and existing skills as well as developing swimming skills





Spanish

Children will be learning a range of new vocabulary linking to types of weather, European countries and the seaside. They will then continue to look at a range of animals, body parts and foods.


This term, children will build on their understanding of Islam and the Importance of Prophet Muhammad (PBUH). Children will also look at holy books, including
