

Year 6: Summer Term



Literacy

Throughout the Summer term, the children in Year 6 will continue to recap and consolidate their understanding of grammatical features and apply these to several writing pieces. They will continue to explore a range of texts and genres giving the children many opportunities to produce extended pieces of writing and show off their skills.

In Reading, the children will continue to consolidate their skills of retrieval, inference and define through weekly comprehension lessons. We will continue to ensure that children are fluent readers with a deep understanding of what they have read and encourage all children to read for pleasure both at school and at home.



Around the world: a comparative study

In Summer I the children will continue to build on their geographical skills to explore The Alps. The children will compare their own local area and discover the similarities and differences between where they live and the awesome Alps. We will explore longitude and latitude along with the human and physical features identified in both places. To complete this topic, the children will produce a comparative report exploring the similarities and differences between the United Kingdom and the Alps.

Humanities History Slavery

During Summer 2 we will begin to look at Slavery. The children will explore the Triangular Atlantic slave trade. They will look at slavery using historical sources and think about what the experiences were like for people. Throughout the topic, it will allow us to look at influential

characters - Harriet Tubman being one of them - a historical figure and her struggle to become free and then look at how she helped free enslaved people. The children will also look at the abolition of the slave trade and slavery in Britain. The children will look at influential people who were appealing against the slave trade and how eventually it was abolished.

PSHE

Throughout this term, the children will look at the topic 'Relationships'. Children will explore how they can build on friendships and develop an understanding of what mental health is, dealing with love and loss and also recognising when others may be trying to take control.

PE

Children will take part in weekly PE sessions where they will focus on track and field events in preparation for sports day.

Dance and Music

The children will take part in dance and music every week. Within these sessions, the children will build on lessons previously taught developing skills in both music and dance.

Science

In science, year 6 will be exploring the three strands of science (biology chemistry and physics) through carrying out investigations using their scientific skills. Additionally, they will be looking at the science of sport and how the use of sports science can enhance an athletes performance.

Numeracy

During the Summer term, the children will focus on consolidating a range of skills that we have covered throughout the academic year including the four operations, percentages, fractions, decimals and statistics, . The children will look at how they can apply these to a

range of real life problems and problems in context in preparation for transition into secondary school. We will continue to help children develop their understanding of reasoning and complete weekly arithmetic practice.



<u>R.E.</u>

In the Summer term, the children will continue to deepen their knowledge and understanding of God and humanism in R.E.

The children will explore the creation of the world and different Christian beliefs.





Homework

Homework will continue to be set in order to consolidate and extend the learning completed in school.

<u>Spellings</u>

All children have been provided with a 104 word statutory spelling sheet (Year 5/6 Spellings). Children will be tested on these spellings on a weekly basis throughout this term.

Physical Education

P.E. will also take place on a Wednesday morning. Children must attend school in their school P.E kit. This consists of a red t-shirt and plain black bottoms. P.E. lessons will focus on a track and field events in preparation for sports day. Once sports day has taken place, the children will be developing their striking and field skills.

We look forward to the final term and seeing the children complete their final year at Trinity before progressing to year 7.


