Art

In Art. Children will be exploring the artist William Morris, who uses inspiration and influence from nature and floral patterns to create print work. Children will create their own art in his style using different techniques.

Literacy

In Literacy, the children will look at a range of texts.

Our main texts throughout the term are The Spiderwick Chronicles, Christophe's Story, Just So and our visual unit; Treasure. In reading, the children will have opportunities to develop their inference skills, which they will use to explore main characters in detail. They will complete various writing activities such as a diary entry, descriptive writing, adventure stories and poetry writing.

Numeracy

This term children will begin to explore geometry including looking at angles, properties of shapes and place value. Children will continue to develop their understanding of multiplication and division as well as time.





Humanities

In Geography, we will be exploring the Railway Revolution in relation to Wolverhampton. We will be investigating the impact on the local landscape and how it put the Black Country on the map. In History, we will lean about the Industrial Revolution and will be using timelines to develop our chronological understanding. We will discover the importance of the Industrial Revolution and what this meant for the world.



Science

In Science this term, children will explore sound, including how sound travels, how it is created and take part in a variety of scientific inquiries and experiments.

Then, children will move onto living things and their habitats where they will identify and classify living things, as well as look at local and distant habitats.

P.E

Children will need to wear their P.E. kit to school on a Tuesday. Children will have the opportunity to participate in a range of team sports such as net and ball games to learn and develop new and existing skills.

R.E

This term, children will explore the Jewish religion and what it means to belong to this. After half term, children will explore art and different festivals in religions such as Islam, Christianity and the Jewish faith.



P.S.H.E

During this term, children will look at dreams and goals. Children will begin to think about their aspirations in life as well as the set backs students may face and how they overcome them. Children will also look at body changes that will occur as they now begin to get older.
