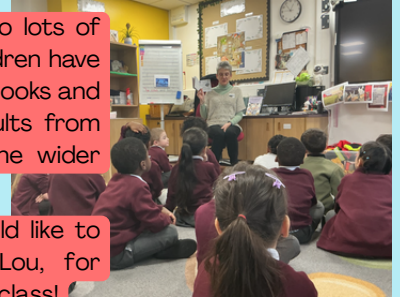

In Year 1s Five Senses lesson, we used our eyes, ears, nose, hands and mouth to explore our senses.

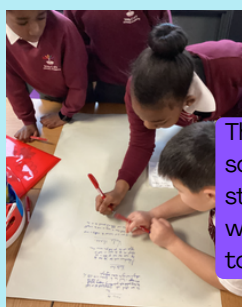
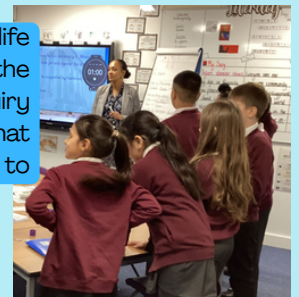


This week, Year 2 enjoyed their outdoor learning sessions. The children learned how to whittle sticks using a knife and also enjoyed a campfire and hot chocolate.

Reception showed cooperation when Tiny the Maths Mascot went missing! The children worked together and followed clues around school. We finally tracked Tiny down in the Library!

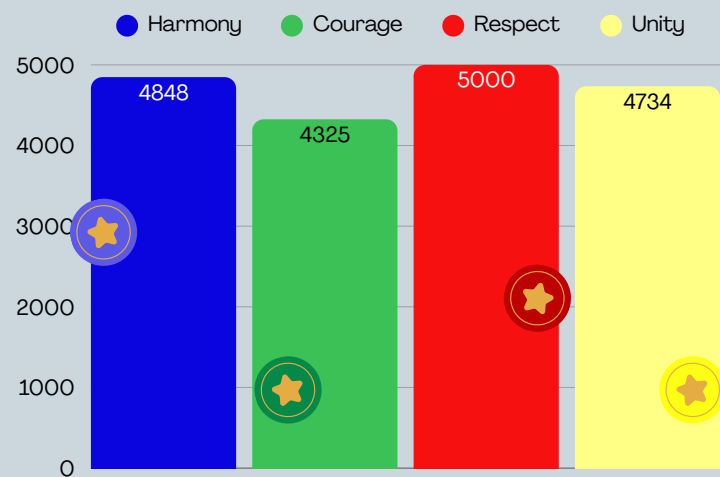


Year 1 cooperation by taking turns and listening to our friends, and commitment by trying our best and staying focused on our learning. We had so much fun testing different foods!

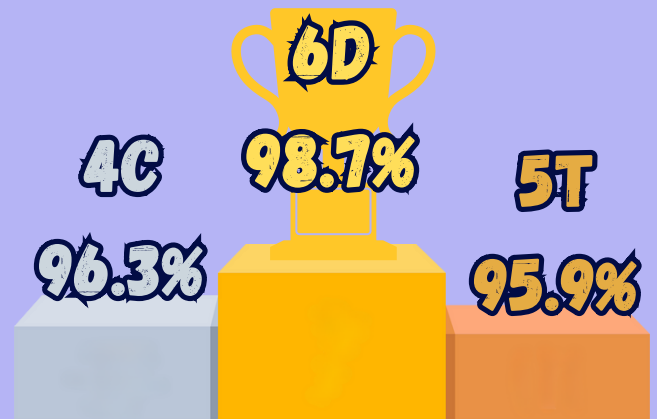
